 Mr. Mortensen reviewed the changes to the RDA budget.

 Mr. Brim gave an overview of the process that the developers had gone through to get the promenade to this point. He then turned the time over to Pete Evans with Flagborough.

 Mr. Evans gave a brief background on the process they went through to find a design team. He then turned the time over to Bronson Tatton with Flagborough and Sam Heritage with OJB (the design firm).

 Mr. Tatton explained that they had a Utah Department of Transportation (UDOT) meeting and needed to get the RDA Board's feedback before that meeting. Mr. Heritage and Mr. Tatton presented the designs for the promenade.

Boardmember Sifuentes left the meeting at 7:22 PM.

 Chair Fullmer called for questions.

 There was a brief discussion about the LED lighting on the promenade.

 Resident Don Overson, living in the Villas subdivision, expressed concern with UDOT's requirement of chain link fences on overpasses. Chair Fullmer said that UDOT had been good at accommodating these changes. There was a brief discussion about the design of the overpass.

 A discussion ensued about the timeline for the promenade.

Background/Discussion:

Utah Code Section 17C-5-302 requires that a community reinvestment agency adopt an annual budget. The Vineyard RDA has typically adopted the final RDA budget on the same night that the Vineyard Municipal Council adopts the city budget. RDA Staff recommends the adoption of the Vineyard RDA Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget as outlined in the attached **detail worksheet**.

VINEYARD REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY RESOLUTION U-2023-05

A RESOLUTION OF THE VINEYARD REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY APPROVING AND ADOPTING A BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2023-2024.

WHEREAS, Section 17C-1-601.5, Utah Code Annotated, requires the Vineyard Redevelopment Agency (“Agency”) to prepare and adopt an annual budget for each fiscal year, which fiscal year is to be the same as the fiscal year of the city of Vineyard; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has prepared the budget for the fiscal year 2023-2024 which is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the Agency has given due notice as required by statute and held a public hearing on June 14, 2023, for the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 Budget; now

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE VINEYARD REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY AS FOLLOWS:

- Section 1. The Agency hereby adopts the annual budget for the Fiscal Year 2023-2024 which is attached hereto and incorporated herein.
- Section 2. In order to fulfill the Agency’s obligations under Section 17C-1-601.5(6)(a), Utah Code Annotated, the Chair or her designee, is hereby authorized and directed to file a copy of the budget with the county auditor, the State Tax Commission, the state auditor, the State Board of Education, and each taxing entity from which the agency receives project area funds. Pursuant to Section 17C-1-601.5(6)(b), Utah Code Annotated, the requirement of Subsection (6)(a) to file a copy of the annual budget with the state as a taxing entity is met if the agency files a copy with the State Tax Commission and the state auditor. This shall be done within 90 days after adoption of the Budget.
- Section 3. This Resolution shall be effective as of the date of adoption.
