3.1 Recommendation for City Council of ARCH Grant Funding Allocation(s)

The ARCH Commission will vote to determine how to recommend that City Council allocates the ARCH Grant Funding.

 Parks and Recreation Director Vawdrey discussed the policies of presenting the ARCH Grant Funding to City Council. The commission discussed Carry On and The Heritage Foundation's grant applications changed since deciding the grant approvals during the previous meeting. A discussion ensued about what changes should be made with this new information. Chair Sidwell suggested changing the ARCH Grant funding for Carry On because of the liability issues that have not been faced since questioning Carry On about the project. Parks and Recreation Director Vawdrey suggested using the ARCH Grant funds that will not be towards an applicant to help the city skate park fundraiser.


A discussion ensued about specifying ARCH Grant funding towards Utah Lake Association's grant for the Paddle with Care event.

 The final ARCH Grant Fund recommendation was Vineyard Library: \$3,630, Friends of the Vineyard Library: \$2,000, Carry On: \$0, Vineyard Heritage Foundation: \$0, Utah Valley Symphony: \$2,000, Utah Lake Foundation: \$3,800, Atomic Athletics: \$0, and Supplies for a Better Future Foundation: \$0. The remaining \$11,430 will stay in the RAP Tax Fund for the Skate Park.
